



CESMA-UEMS European Exam in A/VM



Every Year, 1 Day Before European Angiology Days

Part 1a

- One week before the exam, the referee selected 100 questions from the database and centralised to Ozone that introduced them in the server.
- Once in the final form, access to the **100 question** database was opened to the 5 commission members, for revision. If some questions are invalidated for different medical reasons they are replaced with other questions from the database.
- The multiple choice question (MCQ) exam takes place in a building of the University of Milan, in L. Sacco Hospital. Computers are connected to the central server via internet. Duration of the MCQ exam was two hours. During this time, answers were diretly introduced in the computer and centralised to the server (Ozone).

Part 1 b

- **Results** of the written exam provided to the commission after the clinical exam expressed as a number of correct answers (out of the 100).
- The written exam grade represented by the number of correct answers divided by ten.
- 2013 (2nd Edition). All candidates had more than 60% correct answers (minimum score). 86% candidates had between 70% and 81% correct answers.

Part 2

- Cases reflected complex clinical conditions, mostly emergency ones.
- Candidates had to interpret clinical history and offer their interpretation.
- A discussion with commission members started and candidates had to ask for successive additional information: clinical exam findings, biological results, non-invasive and invasive exploration findings etc.
- In relation to these results, candidates had to suggest different diagnostic possibilities, to stage future evaluation and to decide therapeutic options..
- At the end of the clinical case exam (30 minutes), each candidate received a grade (1-10).

Final Evaluation

- The final exam grade, for each candidate, represented the average of the two grades, the first from the written MCQ exam, the second from the clinical case exam.
- The commission required a final grade of at least 6.5 (on a 1-10 scale), in order to validate the exam.
