- 1. How to conduct effective consultation
- 2. How to assess lifestyle and behaviour
- 3. How to perform a respectful physical examinations
- 4. How to provide comprehensive care to AYAs with chronic conditions (including transitional care)




### Adolescent medicine: Transition vs Transfer



#### **HEALTH CARE TRANSITION** is the

process of moving from a child/family-centered model of health care to an adult/patient-centered model of health care, with or without transferring to a new clinician. It involves planning, transfer, and integration into adult-centered health care.


**TRANSFER** is official transfer of treatment from paediatric to adult health care.



The content outlining the required competencies for adolescent and young adult care has been developed.

Paediatricians, trainers, school specialists, and adolescent physicians have been contacted.

An idea of module (EPAs) for transition care, including school physicians, has been finalized.

We are currently identifying trainers and training centers ready to facilitate the program, with potential centers in Greece, Sweden, Switzerland, and Finland.

Next, we need to finalize the duration of the training programs and agree on the evaluation methods

Additionally, we are working towards reaching an agreement with UEMO and relevant specialist sections on the next steps
